INVITATION TO CONFESSION *

Leader: Friends, God has named us beloved, and yet, this can be easy to forget. In a world of scarcity and threats, in a world that is rarely satisfied, the bravest thing we can do is trust that we belong here. So let us now turn to confession to tell the truth of our lives—to trust that even here, God's love is boundless. Let us pray:

RESPONSIVE PRAYER CONFESSION *

Leader: Divine Creator, we come before you with humble hearts, acknowledging our shortcomings and seeking forgiveness. We confess, O God, that we have subjected others to the kind of rejection and misunderstanding that you yourself experienced in the form of Jesus.

People: We try to control the paths of those we love, deeming them "out of their minds" or unworthy of acceptance when they veer from our expectations for how they "should" be or whom they "should" love. Meanwhile, in moments of doubt, we have sometimes sought those who do not understand our truth instead of finding solace in the chosen family you have blessed us with. Have mercy on us, O God, when we have believed what others say about us rather than what you promise. Have mercy on us, O God, when we have caused others to doubt your love.

Leader: Forgive us for the moments we stand in our own way or in the way of others—dimming a God-given light, participating in the silencing of God-given voices. Forgive us, O God, for the times when we have allowed ego to overshadow our ability to extend solidarity and support to our most marginalized siblings. Like Esther, who risked her life to advocate for her people, help us to use whatever privilege or advantages we possess to uplift the voices of those who are vulnerable and oppressed. Grant us the courage to stand in solidarity with our queer and trans siblings, even when doing so puts us at risk or challenges our comfort. In times of fear and uncertainty, may we find solace in your promises, O God. Even if our earthly relationships falter, you remain steadfast in your love for us.

People: Strengthen us with the knowledge that you will always take us in and hold us close, especially when we feel alone or misunderstood by those we hold dear. Help us, O God, to live authentically and boldly as the children you created us to be. Give us courage to trust our belovedness even in a world that sometimes threatens to snuff out the life that has been breathed into us by God. Strengthen us to embody your love and courage in all that we do.

THE SACRAMENT OF HOLY COMMUNION *

Leader: Beloved children of God, as we gather here this morning, we are the church! In this moment, we respond to the words of Jesus, who tells us: “...where two or three are gathered in my name, I am there among them.” And it is with the power of Christ that we proclaim that this table is open to all people — no matter who you are or what you believe or what you’ve been told.

People: Here at the Lord’s table we remember the simple gathering of a chosen family that came together for a meal that proclaimed a new way of being in this world.

Leader: We remember God’s radically inclusive love made real in the life, ministry, death, and resurrection of Jesus. We remember the One who befriended the forgotten, embraced the outcast, and saw the Image of God in all people.

People: We remember the One who confronted every power that disconnected, marginalized, oppressed, and “other-ed.” It is here at this table that we find hope and imagination to see God’s dream and promise of a world of wholeness, and it is here that we receive the nourishment and strength to continue on the paths of justice.

Leader: We recall that on the night he was betrayed, Jesus took a loaf of bread, and when he had given thanks, he broke it and said, “This is my body that is given for you. Do this in remembrance of me.” In the same way he took the cup, saying, “This is my blood, my very life, poured out for you. Do this, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of me.” God, we thank you for breathing this world into existence and proclaiming from its birth: “It is good.”

People: We come to you with gratitude for the endless blessings that we see, feel, and know on our journeys of life. We celebrate the rich diversity of your creation — every beautiful body, every shade of skin, every expression of love.

Leader: Through your Spirit, open our hearts to the joy we can find in the midst of life's challenges. Remind us that we are loved — fiercely and forever. And however the world may try to hold us down or tell us who to be, remind us that nothing can separate us from your presence. And so as we come to this feast, we pray with the words you taught us to pray:

All: Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name; thy kingdom come, thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread; and forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us; and lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil. For thine is the kingdom, and the power, and the glory forever. Amen.

Leader: Beloved children of God, the table is set. Come and feast with the One who loves you more than you can possibly imagine.
