MESSAGE FROM CALVARY'S HOSPITALITY PARKING TEAM

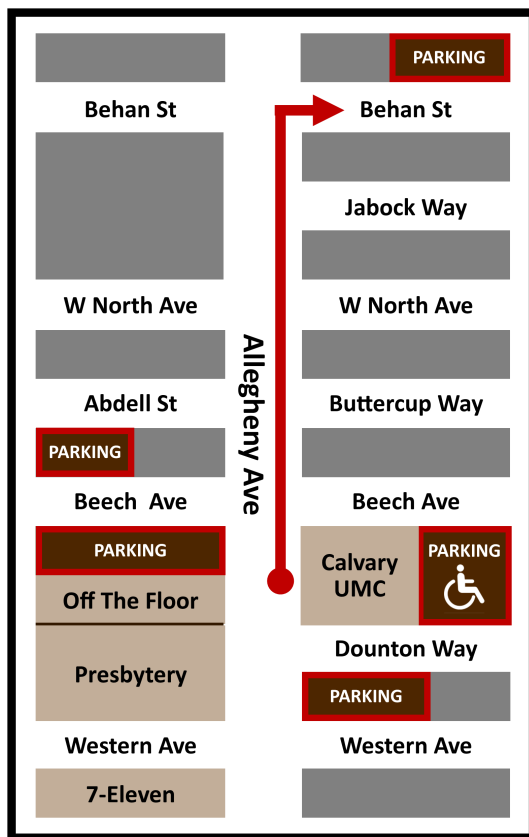

BATHROOM RENOVATION COMING IN 2025 A MESSAGE FROM BRIAN BURNS, CHAIR OF TRUSTEES

After nearly 130 years of service, the restroom facilities at Calvary are ready for a long overdue makeover and expansion.

For the last 10 years or so, the idea of increasing restroom space has been kicked around and several plans were suggested, but for one reason or another, never completed. In January of 2024, Rev. Beth Nelson charged the trustees with the task of creating more restroom space, especially on the first floor. After a few discussions, the trustees engaged Ryan Croyle with Zero Commute Architecture, LLC to create a new space that creatively utilizes our unique building layout.

The basics of the new plan call for moving the existing kitchenette to the first alcove of the nursery, transforming the old kitchenette into a proper men's and ladies' room, remodeling the existing restroom into a fully accessible unit, and providing zoned air conditioning for the new space, as well as the parlor, music office, and Sunday School office.

While the engineer is in the building, we are also exploring the logistics of updating the basement restrooms, and the potential of upgrading our heating system to allow for more efficient control and comfort, as well as the possibility of air conditioning.

All of this work will be completed with several thoughts guiding the process: create a new efficiently designed space, increase energy efficiency and comfort, and choose products to blend and complement the existing space.
